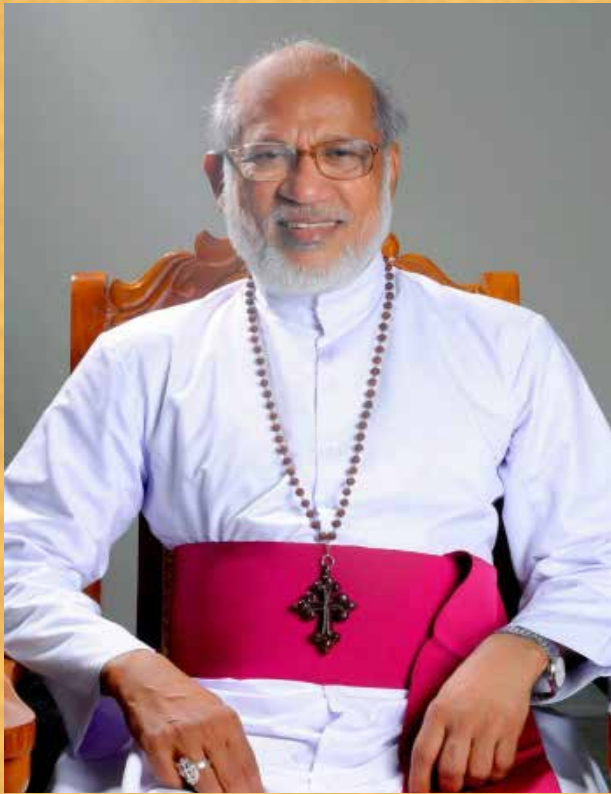

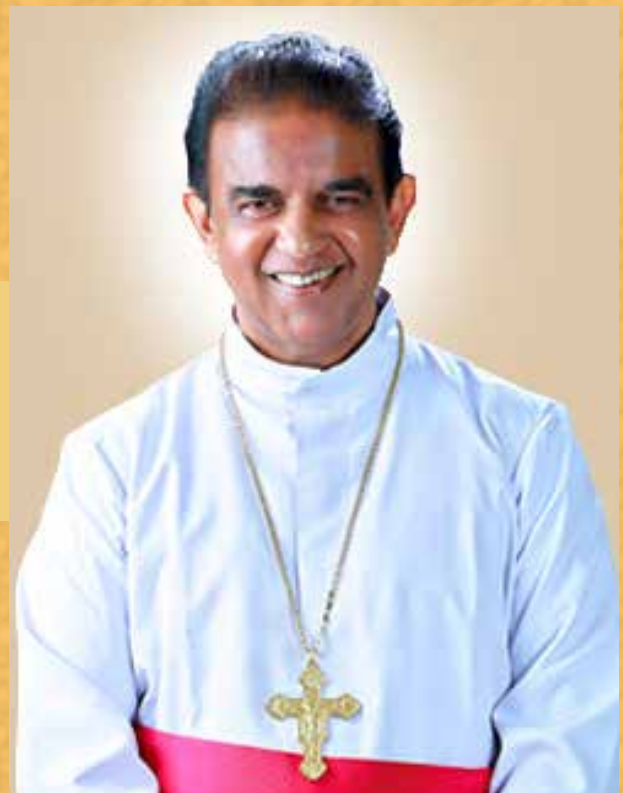

ANNUAL REPORT

PRINCIPAL

NIMIT is a premier educational institution under the University of Calicut with the exemplary mission to mould individuals into successful and vibrant professionals and to function as effective and empathetic human beings. I take this opportunity to present the annual report for the academic year 2021-2022, which saw a revival of active educational activities as well as many success stories and accomplishments.

We began our foray into new academic year by remodelling the Administrative Wing of NIMIT

for its effective functioning thereby fructifying its vision to become a centre par excellence. Two Vice Principals were appointed in the college to focus on Academics as well as Campus Management. An Examination Centre was set up for the conduct of all examinations as per the norms of University. In order to plan and administer development activities of the employees of the institution, an HRD cell was also formed.

To explore the limitless possibilities of tourism and hospitality industry, a new course, Bachelor of Hotel Administration was granted by the University of Calicut in the academic year 2021-22.

On recognising the fact that if the College has to stay abreast of the

times, it has to strike out in new directions. Learning a foreign language opens doors of opportunity and is essential to develop and sustain a strong footing in the global economy. A Foreign Language Cell was established in the campus to cater to the need of both students and faculty members. Along with this, a division of Naipunnaya International started functioning in the college, offering job opportunities to the students.

Regular academic assessments were carried out to identify areas of improvement so as to continue on the path of quality expansion. In line with this, the existing Add-on Programmes were improvised with a certification from STED Council.

It was indeed a proud moment for us when Naipunnaya Business School, our sister concern, scaled a new benchmark with NAAC B++ grade.

Earn While Learn programme, one of the best practices of the institution, was introduced on realizing the need to bridge gap between industry expectation and institution, opening up a plethora of part time job opportunities to students.



NAIPUNNYA EXCELLENCE AWARD

Since 2019, NIMIT has instituted Naipunnnya Excellence Award for the Best Higher Secondary School to appreciate the outstanding performance and achievements of higher secondary schools in the fields of academics and co-curricular sectors and this year St. Joseph's Higher Secondary School bagged the overall position.

CURRICULUM DELIVERY AT NIMIT

Curriculum development is an essential component of any educational institution. In order to ensure effective curriculum delivery, NIMIT has adopted its unique innovative methods and systematic strategies. The Handbook of NIMIT provides a solid foundation, guiding and familiarizing its students with the policies and procedures of the institution. Learning from opportunities thrown up by the pandemic, the college has successfully switched to a digital platform through Linways LMS for managing academic activities from attendance to online quizzes. To assess the academic performance of students, Continuous Internal Evaluations comprising of five exams were carried out, followed by PTWA meetings, thereby updating the parents with the performance of their wards. In addition to this, Add-on Programmes approved by STED Council were offered to impart job skills to students, thus enabling them to acquire additional certificates along with their regular Degree Programmes. Internships, Projects and Study tours were organized to avail practical exposure.

TEACHING AND LEARNING EVALUATION

NIMIT has always focused on imparting quality education imbued with moral values to its students through effective teaching-learning experiences. Interactive instructional techniques like Earn and Learn Programmes, Industry interactions, Stream-wise webinars, Workshops,

Panel discussions, National/ international conferences, Ability Tests, Bridge Courses, Walk With Scholar, Peer Teaching and Cultural Visits are regularly organized by all the Departments to enhance the skills of students thereby equipping them to face the competitive world which is in a constant flux.

The Department of Training and Development is solely dedicated to transforming students providing a new level of exposure and learning experience. The Department effectively functions through several initiatives like Skill Enrichment Programme (SEP), Leading Hands Programme (LHP), Meraki, Synergia, Finishing Touch, English Language Lab training etc., where students explore their hidden talents, fine tune skillsets and boost self-confidence.

RESEARCH, INNOVATIONS AND EXTENSION

Since we envision NIMIT to be a research-oriented institution, we have begun to lay greater emphasis on research. Naavigyan, Institution's ISBN journal promotes research culture, encouraging faculty to publish research papers. Significant and increased volume of research is being undertaken by all departments as witnessed by the increasing number of research articles getting published in UGC journals. It also ensures the continuous professional development of its faculty by organising Faculty Development Programmes and Faculty Enhancement Programmes every month which includes research paper and interdepartmental quizzes. Faculty Exchange Programmes were also conducted helping them to gain fresh trains of thoughts and ideas as well as exposure to new study environments.

In line with the Institution's mission to mould students to function as

effective and empathetic human beings, grounded with personal integrity and social commitment, various Extension, Outreach and CUSSP activities are organised. The students of



NIMIT constantly engage with larger social causes. The activities of the NSS unit reflect this spirit. Unnath Bharat Abhiyan, an initiative of MHRD is effectively functioning in the college, focused on social and economic betterment of nearby villages. In order to sensitize students on the need to protect nature and sustainable development, the college promotes agricultural activities among students.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

The enviable and exceptional growth of NIMIT in the higher education sector demanded the physical expansion of the institution. The newly revamped media centre functions with the objective of producing quality e-contents with recording facility as well as providing opportunities for students to experiment with new techniques and technologies. The full-fledged library with e-resources has an extensive collection of books and reference materials for satisfying the academic and research needs of the students and faculty. A jumping pit was constructed for the smooth conduct of sports activities.

IT SUPPORT

The institution has an effective IT support team to keep up with technological changes that provides technical support for all the activities of the college. The department has also developed many application softwares for the institution as well as outsourced many. 'Smart Support' is a software developed by the IT team for receiving maintenance complaints, planning, tracking and report maintenance of electronic and electrical equipment. The Department also provided technical support for the creation of digital content, live streaming of various seminars and classes through institution's YouTube channel and maintenance of the institution's social media accounts (Facebook, Instagram, Twitter).

STUDENT SUPPORT AND PROGRESSION

The institution has always encouraged students' participation in various activities thereby facilitating the development of skills and competencies. It promoted the active participation of the students in social, cultural and leisure activities by organising celebrations like Avani, Nativity, Expressions and Vismaya, providing platform for the students to showcase their talents. The Department of Physical Education offers a comprehensive view of physical education as an educational process by providing intensive training to students as well as organising various sports activities like observation of International Yoga Day, CORSA- National Sports Day, Physical Fitness Components Test and many more.

The Department of Physical Education has brought many laurels to the college. We are proud to share that four of our students were selected for the 3rd phase of Indian Netball Team Coaching Camp for the Asian Championship. The Department has also secured many awards and achievements at National, State as well as District Level. Our impressive list of winners stands testimony to our accomplishments such as second runners up in Volleyball, Roller Sports, Netball (Women), Korfball (Mixed) and Shuttle Badminton Individual (Men). We are proud to see our teams being the winners for Tug of War at the University level for Men, Women and Mixed category.

THE PLACEMENT CELL has been able to make laudable achievements over the past years in securing jobs for students. NIMIT ensures that the students are groomed and trained according to the standard

requirements of the industry. Various add-on programmes and certificate courses provided to enhance their employability quotient. Also, the Training Department offers them 90 hours soft



skill training which equip them to take up future challenges of the industry. A Student chapter of Thrissur Management Association(TMA), an affiliate of All India Management Association (AIMA) was started in the campus to promote managerial talent among executives, entrepreneurs, practicing managers and professionals. The institution got an opportunity to collaborate with Young Indians (YI), an integral part of Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) which is a movement for Indian Youth to converge, lead, co-create and influence India's future. An online Job Fair was also conducted giving opportunities for many job aspirants.

GOVERNANCE, LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT

The strong governance and leadership has enabled NIMIT to foster the culture of excellence and innovation in the higher education sector. The Governing Body, Board of Studies, Academic Council and IQAC are the strong pillars of the Institution. 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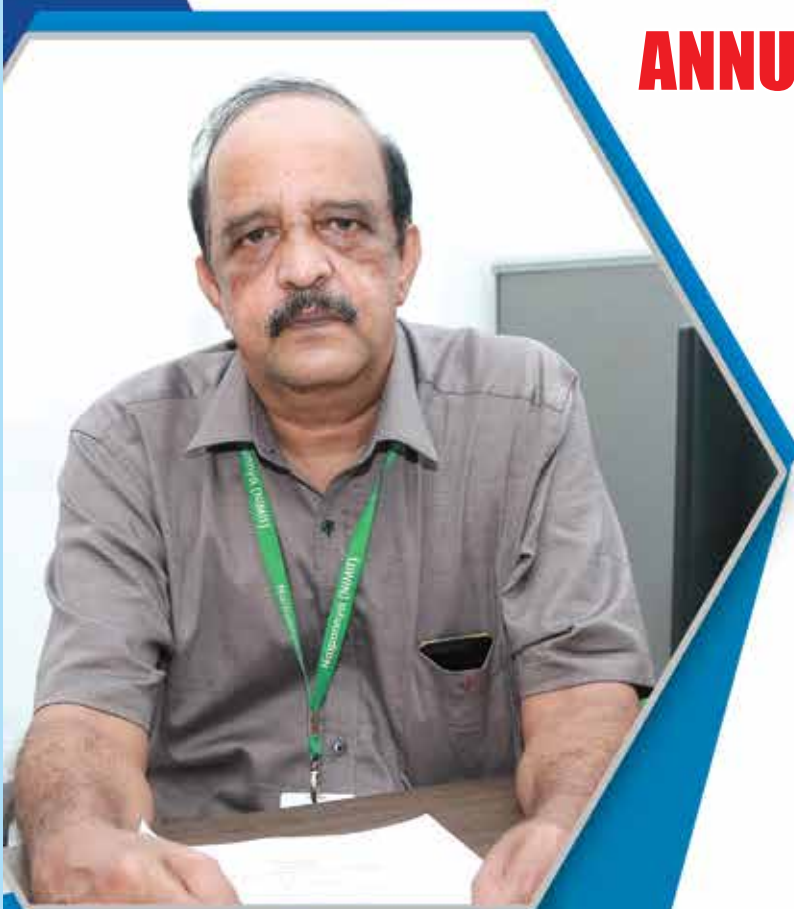

In UG, the department offers B.com with three specialisations, viz, Finance, Computer Application and Cooperation and BBA. In P.G., the Department offers M.Com with Finance as specialization. The Department has 680 students doing various UG programmes and 42 students doing P.G. programme. The department has 28 faculty members in which eight are having Ph.D and four are having M.Phil Degrees.

CAPABILITY ENHANCEMENT

A Bridge Course on Basics of Accounting was provided for first year non-commerce students. It was conducted in the beginning of the first semester. 42 students attended the bridge course.

With a view to enhance the employability, the Department has provided three different Add-on courses: Diploma in International Finance and Accounts, M.S. Excel and Tally software-in this academic year for final year UG students. 122 students have opted for the Diploma in International Finance and Accounts, 48 students selected the MS Excel course and 45 students opted the Tally Software course.

The department is offering CMA which is a professional qualification in cost and management accounts having much demand in the national and international job market. 32 students UG classes are undergoing CMA course this year.

All first year students attended certificate course in language skill development offered by the Department of English.

TRAINING PROGRAMMES

DEPARTMENT – AN OVERVIEW

CAREER GUIDANCE AND PLACEMENT

The career guidance programmes were carried out for final year UG and PG students very effectively by the Placement cell in the department. Students got the opportunity to interact with the experts during the session. Webinar on "MBA as a career option" was also conducted. 30 hours training programme was given to all second year PG students to help them in writing competitive exams. With regard to placement, I am happy to mention that 3 students have got placement from New Year group of Companies and 48 students were shortlisted for final interview of ESAF, Sutherland etc.

PARTICIPATIVE LEARNING / INTERACTIVE LEARNING

The main objective of this programme is to give the students an idea regarding what is happening in the industrial world. Along with the class room session, the practical exposure of the work life is also provided to the students. The department has conducted 2 series of Industry Interactions which consisted of 8 Sessions. The experts from different Industries have taken fruitful Sessions for each stream. The sessions conducted were fully in connection with their specialized area. These sessions were very much helpful for the students

to get an idea about what is happening in the industries rather than the classroom learnings. 20 students of the department have got opportunity to do internships in reputed companies.

CLUB ACTIVITIES

Two important Clubs functioning in the department are Entrepreneurship Development Club and Quiz Club.

The Entrepreneurship Development Club (ED Club) of NIMIT had organized a Covid help desk at the time of the Pandemic to help the affected people. Friday Market was conducted on every Friday with a view to give students a real learning experience in buying and selling of products. It was an opportunity to students to earn while they learn.

The 'Flair Com' Quiz Club offers a Unique and exciting way to motivate, inspire, encourage and reward students for their quest for knowledge. In association with "Swaraj" the Independence Day Celebrations, the quiz Club had conducted a competition on the topic "Indian Independence Day Related History". The second Quiz Competition was conducted in association with 'Avani', the Onam Celebration.

OUTREACH PROGRAMME

For the seventh consecutive year, the department organized National Conference; this year with the theme “Emerging Trends in Cloud Computing”. The keynote address was given by Dr. Krishna Prasad K, Associate Professor and Research Coordinator, College of Computer Science & Information Technology, Srinivas University, Mangaluru. Dr. Sarika S, Assistant Professor, NIMIT, chaired the session. There were 11 papers presented at the conference which were published in the conference proceedings. Computer Science students from NIMIT also presented technical papers at the conference, under the students’ research initiative.

Three add-on courses were given to all students of BSc CS and BCA. Final year students attended 12-week MOOC on “Introductory Concepts of Digital Computing.”, Second-year students attended 30 hours course on “Python Programming”, certified by STED Council and first-year students attended 30 hours course on “Basic Communication Skills”, certified by Naipunnya International. A workshop on “Introduction to Electronic Devices” was given to the second-year BCA students. The objective of this workshop is to give a brief idea about the electronic devices, circuits, and a few lab experiments, which was intended to provide a hands-on session for BCA students.

During this academic year, Department started with the initiatives like internships, Earn while Learn and funded project programmes for the students. The internship is offered online to all final students in the form of 25 hours of training

Department of Computer Science is able to achieve its objectives set at the beginning of the academic year 2021-22.

One-day Hardware and Network Troubleshooting workshop were arranged for final year BSc CS and BCA students. The objective of this workshop is to provide hands-on training to the students on hardware and network-related concepts and troubleshooting.



on “Fullstack Development”. Earn while Learn programme is intended to provide an opportunity for students to earn an income while they pursue their undergraduate degree. Students of final year BSc CS and BCA got an opportunity to take up funded projects, which enabled them to work with the IT companies.

The Department also took the initiative to launch an extension programme with the name, ‘e-Assist’, in collaboration with Koratty Grama Panchayath, to provide awareness to the public on various e-services provided by the government through Akshaya centers.

To strengthen the concepts learned in the course ‘Computer graphics’, a mini-project was given to second-year BCA students. Students were able to explore and experiment with graphic library functions while writing programs.

The Student Support Programme (SSP) received warm support from the students. Under this programme, academically weak students were given additional support in the form of extra classes and peer teaching. Students who performed well in academic activities were given sessions to encourage them to explore the higher realms of their respective subjects. Two such initiatives by the department are sessions on “Java Script” and “Writing Research article”, given to first and second-year students respectively.

Faculty members attended six days of national-level online Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on Outcome Based Education (OBE). Dr. Sarika S presented a paper at Global Knowledge Research Foundation, Jaipur. Dr. Sarika S, Assistant Professor and Ms. Laiiby Thomas, Assistant Professor, Department of Computer

Science at NIMIT along with MSc CS students presented papers at the National Conference at Santigiri College of Computer Sciences, Vazhithala.

The academic progression of faculty members in the department reached new heights during this academic year. Six faculty members in the department are pursuing their doctoral studies. There were 21 publications by the faculty members, one Scopus indexed publication, nine journal publications with ISSN and eleven publications in ISBN book proceedings.

Final year BSc CS and BCA students had been to Kodaikanal and Wayanad respectively as a part of their study tour. Students took part in various management and IT fests conducted by other institutions.

A good number of 2021 graduated batch of students are placed with reputed companies like Deloitte, TCS, Infosys, WIPRO and Capgemini. I am pleased to inform the fact that we attained cent percent pass in the University examination for BSc CS and BCA 2019-21 graduated batches.

Department of Additional Languages had its modest beginnings in the academic year 2021-22. The department facilitates second language common courses in Malayalam, Hindi and French for all UG Programmes in the college. The team members of the department are Dr. Tessy Poulouse, Ms. Rejitha K Ravi, Ms. Simitha K S, Dr. Sonia S and Ms. Anna Binny.

The department conducted several activities in its commencement year. The first programme of the department was the Malayalam Webinar, conducted on 22nd July 2021. The resource person of the day was Ms. Vijayarajamallika , the first transgender poet in Kerala. The topic was “പ്രാസം ജൈനർ ജീവിതവും സാഹിത്യവും” (Transgender life & Literature). The webinar analysed seriously the connectivity between the gender lives and literature.

Hindi Day is celebrated on 14th September every year in India. Hindi language was declared as the official language of the country on 14th September 1949. To mark the day, the Department of Additional Languages, proudly conducted the Hindi Day Celebration, ‘SAURABH 2021 on 14th September 2021. An online quiz was conducted through Google Forms for the faculty members and students on that day. The students from all the Departments joined together in a video in which the students spoke about the importance of Hindi Language and a group dance was also performed with a song about the Hindi Language. It was followed by an expert talk on the topic “राष्ट्र भाषा, राजभाषा एवं संपर्क भाषा के रूप में हिंदी का भविष्य’, by Dr. Leena Samuel, Assistant Professor, Panampilly College, the Resource Person of the day.



Another pioneering initiative of the Department was the inauguration of The Foreign language cell, 'La Linguistique' on 1st December 2021. The programme was inaugurated online by Rev. Fr. Dr. Johnson Vadakkumchery , Director of Naipunnya International. Language experts of the Naipunnya International Rev. Fr. Dr. Antony Kavunguvalappil (German language HoD) and Ms. Patricia Gonzalez (French and Spanish language HoD, Spain) enlightened the audience by delivering their concepts on the importance of foreign languages. The presidential address was delivered by the Principal Rev. Fr. Dr. Paulachan K.J. The felicitation was given by Rev. Fr. Jose Karachira (Campus Minister).

A Multilingual National Level Webinar was organized on 19th March 2022, in three languages. In the morning session, Malayalam and French webinars, and in the afternoon session Hindi webinar were conducted.

For the Malayalam webinar the Resource person was Dr. Aju .K. Narayanan, Associate Professor, School of Letters M.G. University. The topic was “ചലച്ചിത്രകലയുടെ ലാവണ്യശാസ്ത്രം” (Aesthetics of Cinema). The resource person dealt with the history, evolution and aesthetics of film precisely. Instead of a superficial presentation Dr. Aju. K. Narayanan gave an in-depth critical analysis on the topic.

Dr. Shoba Liza John, Associate Professor, Head, Dept. of Additional Languages, S.H. College, Thevara was the resource person for the French webinar. The topic was “Apprenons le français avec des chansons” (Learn French with songs). In the session the resource person dealt with learning through songs made the students to sing by changing the lyrics.

For the Hindi webinar the Resource person was Dr. M.M. Mangodi, Regional Director, Mahatma Gandhi International Hindi University, Vardha. The topic was “समकालीन साहित्य में निहित विविध विमर्श” .He elaborated on various social issues citing examples from literature.

NEXUS 21-22

Starting college can cause much anxiety in the heart of a new college student because of all the unknowns .Student orientation programme plays an important role in a students transition to a college life. Orientation programmes are aimed at familiarizing the students to an unknown campus environment, its faculties and infrastructure. It enables them to make essential connection with studies and develop network among other peers .



Two days offline orientation program for the freshers gave an overview of the complete realm of our college, from academics to social activities. This was conducted from 28/10/21 to 29/10/21 from 9.00am to 1.00pm. The head of various departments and one of the Management team member made the newcomers aware of their opportunities, roles and responsibilities, and examination pattern. This was followed by the training session by the training team. Mr. Justine Thomas, HRD trainer and Psychologist took up the activity filled 4hrs training for two days on the theme 'Happy Learning'. Major topics covered during the session were:

Positive self affirmation
Study skills

Creative visualisation
Clearing the mindset

Career goal setting
Stress management

Decision making

The program agenda was elaborate but activity focused and well planned into stages. The feedback of the participants reveal that it was a wonderful learning experience and the valuable inputs of the training session would surely help them in the future.

FINE TUNE BEHAVIOURAL TRAINING

Learning and fine tuning our behavior is a lifelong proposition. Hence an exclusive behavior enhancement workshop was conducted to remind the first year students on their behavior expectations in campus and providing support to encourage their positive behaviors and prevent problem behaviors. The session covered various topics like youth addictions, Attitude towards teachers and peers, Career focus, interpersonal relationships etc.

The resource person was Mr. Justin Thomas, who is a trainer, an advanced life coach, NLP master practitioner and also a clinical psychologist. 12 first year batches were combined into different groups and addressed during these three days. One to one psychological counselling and therapy was also provided to those students who needed a professional support to overcome their psychological problems.

Feedback of the students mentioned that the topics covered were familiar to them, but was presented in an interesting way. Almost 60 percentage of the students rated it as very effective session and almost 40 percentage rated it as average. The three day session concluded by briefing the faculty about the major concerns of the students and tips to change their attitude towards the problematic students.

FINISHING TOUCH

Interview skills are an essential tool for all students in today's world of employment as there is increasing competition for job vacancies. This is largely due to the rise in graduation rates, consequently there are far more candidates applying for the same jobs. Hence Considering that interview practice for the final year batches are quintessential for their career, Naipunnya Training Department in association with IQAC conducted 5 days interview training session- 'Finishing Touch' by the experts of Mahindra Pride classroom. Walk with Scholar Programme 2021-22

Walk with Scholar (Criteria 2.2.1) aims at building capacities of meritorious students through proper mentoring, guidance and motivation. Unlike other resources, human resources have unlimited potential. The Institution formed an HRD department in June 2021, with the intention of creating a climate that can continuously identify, nurture and use the capabilities of people along with the purpose of streamlining the selection process and other HR related functions. The focus of all aspects of Human Resource Development is on developing the most superior workforce so that the institution and the individual staff members can accomplish their work goals.

In the past year, we implemented a Human Resource Information System (HRIS) which

helped to store employee data, monitor time and attendance effectively, process salary disbursement, and file employee related documents. We started 2021 academic year with 120 employees and in the beginning of 2022 we have 157 employees. This means that we are growing at an average rate of 30%. We were able to recruit teaching and non-teaching staff for various departments due to their growth needs, successfully before the beginning of the new academic year. All employees were given induction by the management team and HoDs.

In an attempt to improve the performance and the evaluation process of the faculty members, we revamped the Performance Appraisal system. The performance of each faculty member is evaluated based on three components. Objectives & Key Results (OKR), Competencies of the faculty member, and Student feedback are the determinants. The annual salary increment method is changed where it will be now based on a hybrid system. The development of a Performance Appraisal software was greatly helpful in efficiently conducting the evaluation process.

The Payroll module of HRIS helped the staff to receive their monthly salary pay slips, and Form 16 and other information online. Future Service Gratuity Fund and Employee medical insurance are newly added employee benefit schemes. Considering employee well-being as of prime importance during the pandemic, our Institution held a free COVID vaccination drive for our staff, in collaboration with Apollo-Adlux Hospital, Karukutty.

Teaching staff and non-teaching staff receive two training sessions separately as a part of staff development. In addition, Faculty Enhancement Program (FEP) is conducted every Thursday, where faculty members are given an opportunity to present their research papers, conduct seminars on a novel and relevant topic, and participate in a knowledge enhancing competitive quiz program.

The department is looking forward to another more staff-enriching and more productive academic year.

printers and other electronic devices in the computer labs, class rooms and staff rooms of each block. We have also taken steps to improve the network facilities in the campus, checking network connections and internet facilities. We have played a major role in servicing hardware products.

Technology will not be able to avoid the onset of a Pandemic; nevertheless, it can assist in managing a crisis more effectively. During the time of Covid-19, uncertainty and constant fear, our willingness to adopt technology has been our lifeline. The department has provided full support to conduct online meetings, classes, competitions, video recording, YouTube live streaming and created so many brochures, e-certificates etc... not only for our college but also for other reputed organizations of our Archdiocese.

The IT Department, as a team, in NIMIT monitors the maintenance of all computer systems, network services and devices, software and IT related functions. The main duties and responsibilities entrusted on us are the maintenance services including hardware, networking, software and Internet of Things.

Hardware maintenance includes assembling and installations of the new computers systems,

This department has started NITCS (Naipunnya IT Consultancy Services) which offers consultancy services to other organizations. Our services include: Software & website development, KOHA & Moodle implementation and training, Google applications training etc... We have developed websites for Bharatmatha School of Legal Studies, Choondi and for Naipunnya Business School, Koratty.



The COVID-19 Pandemic has led to a dramatic loss of human life worldwide and presents an unprecedented challenge to public health, food systems and the world of work. At this juncture the college has started online classes and meeting where the IT department is the backbone of all the online activities. We are the experts in handling ZOOM, GoogleMeet, Webex, Microsoft Teams etc. College has conducted lots of webinars and issued e-certificates to the participants with the help IT department.

Last year we started Naipunnya IT Apprenticeship Programme with the aim of Earn while Learn for Naipunnya students. Five of our Computer Science students were selected as apprentice, and they work with IT team after their regular class hours and they are also given stipend in each month.

IT department has proved its excellence in maintaining the Learning Management System, “Linways”, where we manage personal information of the students, attendance entry, marks tabulation etc. This year we have developed two new software named SmartSupport and MentorMate. SmartSupport software is used to register IT, Electrical and Plumbing related complaints/requests which can be monitored and solved more effectively. MentorMate is used to process all the mentoring details of the students. We also developed an admission software for

collecting and processing the details of new admissions and thus generating the ID cards and bus concession cards automatically using the software. Development of Students Feedback software is another success of the IT team.

As a part of commercializing our software, we sold our software MentorMate to Naipunnya School of Management, Cherthala.

We also have revamped and launched our college website (www.naipunnya.ac.in) using latest website development tools and techniques.

NOTE (Naipunnya Online Training and Examination) Centre under IT department is regularly conducting the recruitment drives of ESAF bank on first and third Saturdays of every month. NSEIT, the IT division of National Stock Exchange is also conducting online examinations in our computer lab for NEET, Indian Institute of Banking and Finance (IIBF), FACT, CUSAT etc.

As the world is moving at a faster pace in the field of Information Technology, we are updating our knowledge and skills on the latest software, implementing it in Naipunnya, making it easier and friendlier to the users.

The Placement cell of Naipunnaya Institute of Management and Information Technology is pleased to see that our graduates and post graduate scholars have impressed minds of recruiters during the placement process. The placement cell helped the scholars to explore the world of employment and new career openings. During 2021-'22, on campus/off campus interviews were arranged and scholars were successfully placed in companies like Infosys, Deloitte, TCS, CTS, Sutherland, ICICI, ESAF, Digital World Private Limited, AL NAWRAS STEEL MIDDLE EAST FZC etc. During the year 2020-21, we could place nearly 50 students from CS, Commerce and Languages.

To increase the internship culture of the students, placement cell works in association with Internshala so that every student student will get a free account on Internshala using which they could start applying for live internship offered by companies.

An online Job Fair, was conducted from 18-10-2021 to 31-10-2021 where the candidates could view vacancies and apply for them. From the same platform, employers can view candidate details, invite them for telephonic / face-to-face interview and communicate with them using the platform itself. An online webinar in connection

Placement Services Cell functions with faculty and student coordinators from each department. They are supported by a Placement Officer who is interacting with the industry to scout for vacancy announcements



with Job Fair for enhancing employability was also organised by the placement cell, NIMIT which supported the candidates to apply for the jobs, this training was given in which topics covered were: how to write a resume, footprints in social media, importance of LinkedIn, how to attend interview etc.

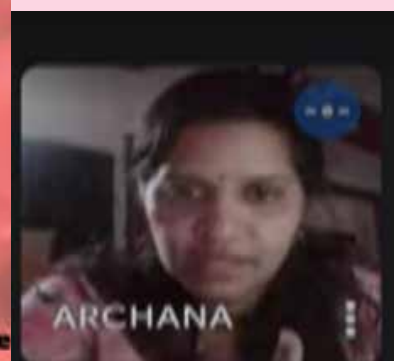
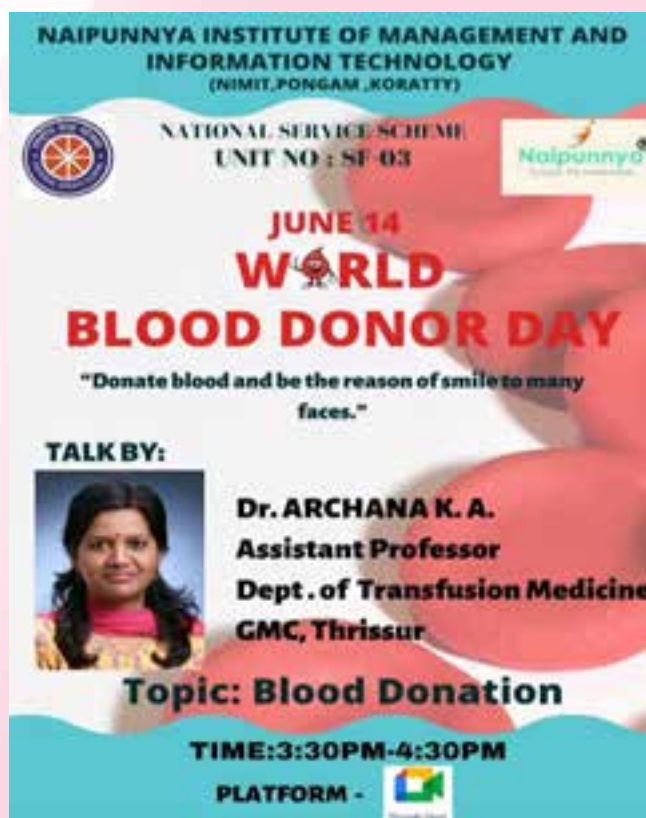
Environment Day

Blood Donor Day

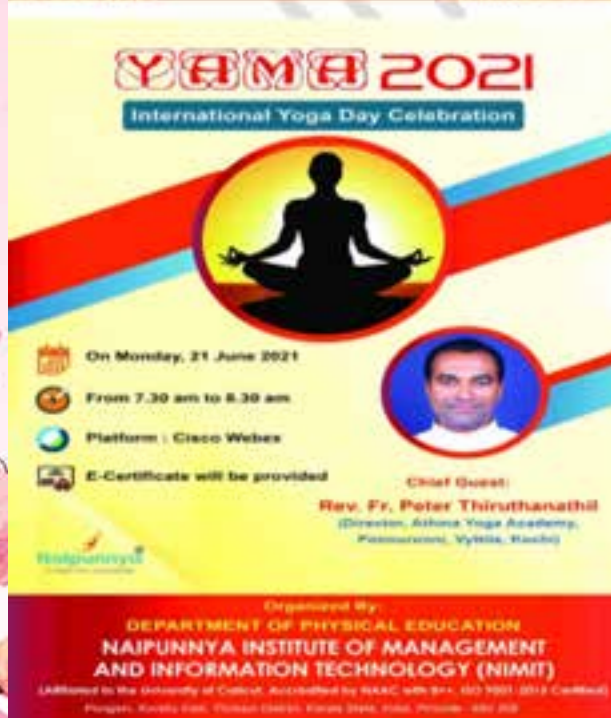
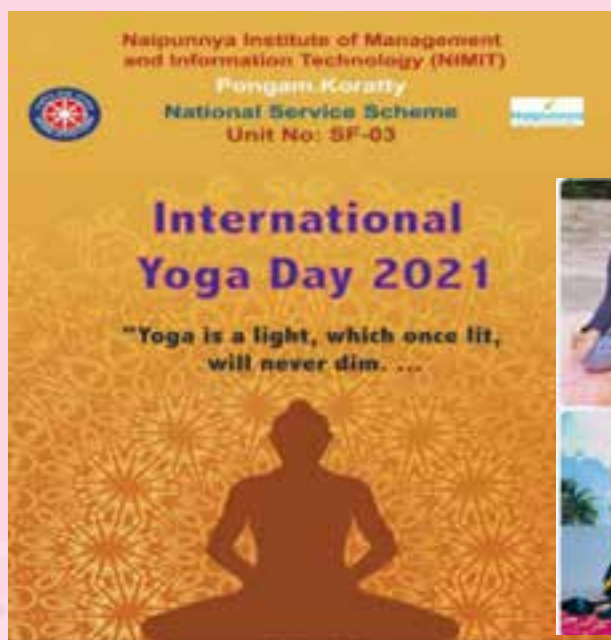

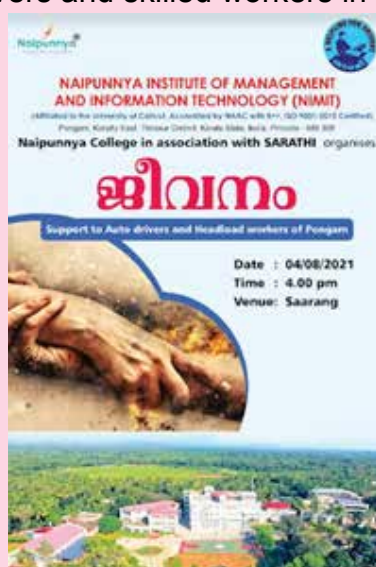
Webinar: Broadening Perspectives on Marriage

Freshers' Connect

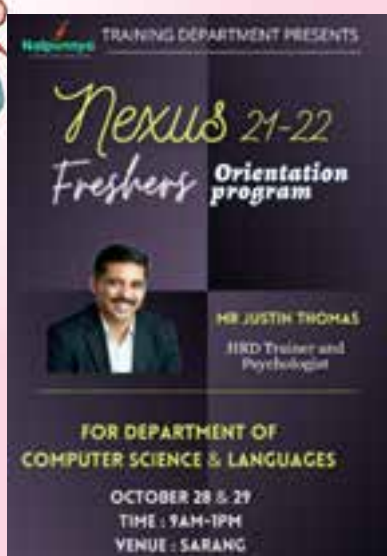

NSS Special Camp

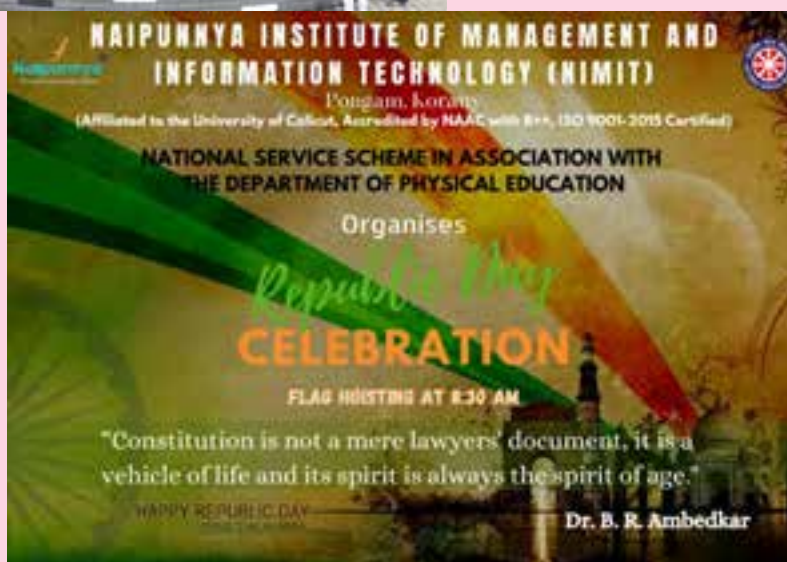

HISTORY OF WHISKEY

The earliest direct account of Whiskey making is found in Scottish records dating from 1494. The whiskeys produced in each country are distinctive in character because of differences in the method of production the type and character of a cereal grains, and the quality and character of the water employed.

Whiskey also spelled whisky any of several distilled liquors made from a fermented mash of cereal grains and including scotch, Irish, and Canadian whiskeys and the various whiskey of the United States. Whiskey is always aged in wooden containers, usually of white oak. The name spelled without an e by the Scots and Canadians and with an "e" in Ireland and the United States, comes from Celtic .

Straight whiskeys are unmixed or mixed only with whiskey from the same distillation period and distiller. Blended whiskeys include mixtures of similar products made by different distillers and in different periods .

Scotch whiskys are somewhat light in body, with a distinctive smoky malt flavour. They are made primarily from barley that is malted and then heated over a peat fire, the oily, acrid smoke of which flavours the malt. Variation among whiskeys of the highlands, lowlands, Campbeltown, and Islay regions are caused partly by differences in the amount of heating the malt receives. The flavoured malt is combined with water, producing a mash and then fermented to make a beer. When the beer is distilled it produces a whisky containing 70 percent alcohol by volume. This





product is successively reduced with water to about 43 percent by volume.

Irish whiskeys taste much like scotch but without the smoky quality. They are produced by methods similar to those for scotch whisky but the malt is not exposed to smoke during roasting. Irish whiskeys pass through three distillations and are sometimes blended with neutral grain whiskeys to produce a lighter – bodied product.

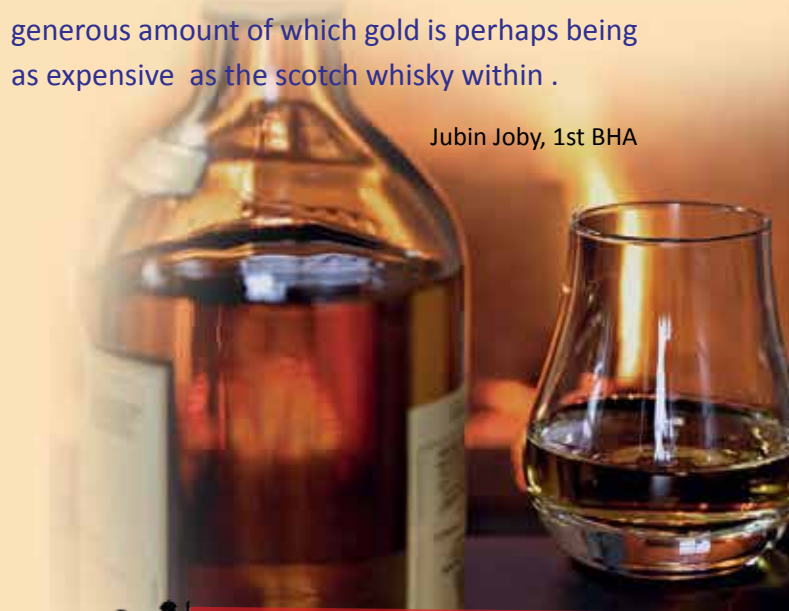
The Canadian whisky industry began in the early 19th century. Canadian whiskeys are light in body and flavoured and neutral grain whisks. They are made from mashes composed of combinations of corn, rye, wheat, and barley malt prepared according to the formula of the individual producer. Canadian whiskeys are usually aged for at least six years, then reduced with water to an alcoholic content of about 45 percent by volume before bottling.

In the United States, whiskey production began early in the 18th century. Major distillation centers are established in Kentucky Pennsylvania and Indiana. Their product is made (usually corn or rye), producing a beer that is distilled to make a whiskey of 80 percent alcohol content by volume. This distillate, high in flavouring substances derived from the original raw materials is reduced with water to about 50- 52 percent alcohol

and aged in unused charred white-oak barrels straight whiskeys may be stored in government bounded warehouse. Bourbon is characterized by the flavour of corn, used as the main raw material . It was first produced in Bourbon country, Kentucky, and the name Bourbon eventually because a general term for similar corn mash whiskeys. Sour mashes used mainly in bourbon production are fermented with yeast including a portion of previously fermented Yeasts , other whiskeys are made from sweet mashes employing only fresh yeast.

Whiskey are consumed both unmixed and mixed in cocktails, punches and highballs. The United States is the worlds largest producer and consumer of whiskey. The oldest known whiskey is the Old Ingledew whiskey. Jack Daniels is a brand of Tennessee whiskey and the best selling whiskey in the world. It is produced in Lynchburg Tennessee by the Jack Daniels home County of Moore is a dry country so the product is not available for purchase at stores or restaurant within the country. The most expensive whiskey ever sold is the Isabellas Islay it cost 43crores . This extravagant yet opulent bottling of cast strength Islay whisky in an English crystal decanter encrusted with 85000 diamonds 300 rubies and generous amount of which gold is perhaps being as expensive as the scotch whisky within .

Now internationally renowned and holding 7 Michelin stars, Ramsay has opened a string of successful restaurants across the globe, from Singapore to the United States. These include a Le Pressoir d'Argent in Bordeaux; five restaurants in Las Vegas (Gordon Ramsay Hell's Kitchen at Caesars Palace, Gordon Ramsay Fish & Chips at The Linq, Gordon Ramsay Steak at Paris, Gordon Ramsay Pub and Grill at Caesars Palace and Gordon Ramsay Burger at Planet Hollywood); two restaurants in Atlantic City (Gordon Ramsay Steak at Harrah's and Gordon Ramsay Pub and Grill at Caesars); two ventures in Versailles (Gordon Ramsay au Trianon & La Veranda); Gordon Ramsay Hell's Kitchen & Bread Street

In 2016, Ramsay launched his own independent next-generation production company, Studio Ramsay, that develops shows and formats for the U.K., U.S. and digital properties.

While best known as a celebrity chef now, Ramsay is successful in a variety of other ventures outside of food and television. Most notably as a published author, Ramsay has released a number of books, many of which have become bestsellers around the world; including his autobiography, Roasting in Hell's Kitchen. In contrast with other developing countries, India has changed a lot since independence and follows a large scale independence. In the nineteenth century, India's great language newspapers and Indian language press came into existence. Indian business groups controlled the India's English language newspapers. The press was subjected to an impressive growth from independence. At the beginning, there were 214 daily newspapers, with forty-four in English and the rest in Indian languages. English language press has a wide circulation throughout India.

Publishing groups in India are of four types. These control national and regional English language and vernacular publications. They are the Times of India Group, the Indian Express Group, the Hindustan Times Group and the Anandabazar Patrika Group. There are numerous small publications also. The circulation of India's newspapers and periodicals is in the order of 60 million published daily. They are published in more than 90 languages. India has more than 90 languages. India has more than forty domestic news agencies. The Express News Service, the Press Trust of India and the United News of India are the major news agencies.

The national television(Doordarshan) and radio(All India Radio, or Akashwani) networks are owned by state and run by the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting. Their news reporting presents the government's point of view. From the Prasar Bharati Act in 1990 provided greater autonomy to Doordarshan and All India Radio. Since 1980s, India has experienced a rapid popularity of television broadcasting. It helped in shaping popular culture and the course of politics. The first television program was broadcasted in 1959. There was television access to 90 percent of the population by 1990.

In 1990s, television undergoes a radical transformation. Transnational satellite broadcasting made its debut in 1991. Satellite broadcasting spread rapidly through India's cities as local entrepreneurs erected dishes to receive signals and transmitted them through local cable systems. Competition from the satellite stations brought radical change to Doordarshan. Doordarshan in 1993 started five news channels to its original National Channel

1812 का रुद्ध



संयुक्त राज्य अमेरिका और ग्रेट ब्रिटन 1812 में युद्ध में गि, इसलिए इसे "1812 का युद्ध" नाम फदया गया। यह युद्ध तीन सातिक ची, यानी 1812 से 1815 तक। यह व्यापार के मुद्दों पर अमेरिकन कानून के बढ़ते गुस्से, अमेरिकी नाफवकम के प्रभाव और मूल अमेरिकन कानून के शकस्ती अफगर्म पंशककत में भारतीय हमलों की फफिटश सहायता के पररणामस्वरूप हुआ (रूजवेल्ट, 113)। हालाँकि कुछ अमेरिकन कानून ने 1812 के युद्ध को स्वतंत्रता का दूसरा युद्ध माना, फिकन इस युद्ध के दौरान न तम अंग्रेजों को कम और नही अमेरिकन कानून को कमई फनणागक फि फमि।

1812 का युद्ध राष्ट्र पफत मैफडसन के शासनकाल के दौरान हुआ था; उन्होंने अंग्रेजों के साथ अमेरिकन कानून की टक्कर के बाद अंग्रेजों के शकस्ती युद्ध की घमषणा की थी। अमेरिकन कानून और अंग्रेजों के बीच संघर्ष भारतीय, अमेरिकन कानून के दुश्मन के फफिटश समथगन के पररणामस्वरूप हुआ था।

भारतीयों ने अमेरिकी प्रशासन को खत्म करने के लिए बहुत प्रयास फकए थे, उदाहरण के लिए, उन्होंने अमेरिकी सैनिकों से डिई डी, फजससे अमेरिकी शककत में कमी आई। इसके अलावा, भारतीयों ने उत्तरी अमेरिका में रहने वाले अंग्रेजों को सुरक्षा की पेशकश की, अंग्रेजों और

भारतीयों के बीच इस घफनष्ठ संबंध ने अमेरिकी कर्मचारी को उत्प्रेरित फकया इसलिए 1812 के युद्ध का प्रकमप हुआ।

1812 युद्ध की फचंगारी अमेरिकी में हाउस ऑफ रिप्रेजेंटेटिव्स में युवा राजनेताओं के एक समूह से थी, फजसे हेनरी क्ले और जॉन कै हिन के नेतृत्व में युद्ध हॉक्स के रूप में जाना जाता था। युद्ध के श कीनम के पास फवफभन्न कारण थे फक उन्होंने अंग्रेजों के शकस्ती युद्ध की घमषणा की मांग क्यम की, और कुछ कारणों में शाफमथे फफिटश अंतरराष्ट्रीय कानून का उल्लंघन जम फवपणन प्रथाओं में व्यवधान का फवरमध करते थे, अंग्रेजों द्वारा फदखाया गया अनादर, और अपहरण अफधफनयम अंग्रेजों की।

उदाहरण के लिए, अंग्रेजों ने व्यापार के लिए मार्ग जाने वाले अमेरिकी जहाजों को जब्त करके फवपणन थथानम में व्यवधान का फवरमध करने वाले अंतरराष्ट्रीय कानून का उल्लंघन फकया। अमेरिकन कानून ने अंग्रेजों द्वारा अपने क्षेत्र में अमेरिकी जहाजों को जब्त करने के कायग को



अनादर का प्रदर्शन माना। इसफिए उन्हमर्न युद्ध कम एक समाधान माना, इसफिए 1812 का युद्ध।

फनदोष अमेररकी नाफवकम का अपहरण करने का फफिटश कायग भी 1812 के युद्ध के कारणम में से एक था, अंग्रेजम ने अमेररकी नाफवकम कम पकड फया और उन्हें गुमि बना फया, इसफिए युद्ध के श कीनम के गुस्से कम बढ़ाने में यमगदान फदया। 1807 का चेसापीक मामा भी 1807 में 1812 के युद्ध में एक महत्वपूर्ण कारक था; फफिटश सैफनक अमेररकी जहाज पर सवार हमने में कामयाब रहे और उन्हमर्न पकडे गए फनदोष अमेररफकयम कम मार डागि, एक ऐसा कायग फजसने अमेररफकयम कम गुस्से से जगि फदया।

अमेररफकयम के तटथता अफधफनयम ने भी 1812 के युद्ध के र्नि में यमगदान फदया, अमेररफकयम कम फांसीसी और अंग्रेजम के बीच हम रहे युद्ध की रुफच या फचंता फदखाए फबना अपनी व्यापारक गफतफवफध करने की आदत थी। अमेररफकयम द्वारा फचफत्रत तटथता अफधफनयम ने अंग्रेजम कम उनका गिदा उठाया।

अमेररफकयम ने उनके जहाजम कम जब्त करके और फनदोष अमेररकी नाफवकम कम पकडकर उनके साथ दुव्यगवहार करना शुरू कर फदया (हन्ने, 107)। फांसीसी के श्कखी 1805 के युद्ध में अंग्रेजम के उत्तराफधकार ने फफिटश और अमेररफकयम के बीच संबंध खराब कर फदए, इससे अमेररकी का पतन हम गया। समुद्र के पार व्यापारक गफतफवफधयम में भागीदारी।

हाफिक फदसंबर 1814 में हस्ताक्षररत गेन्ट की संफध ने 1812 के युद्ध के कारणम से संबंफधत फकसी भी मुदे कम नहीं छुआ, फिकन इसने 1812 के युद्ध के अंत में बहुत यमगदान फदया। अमेररकी और फफिटश प्रफतफनफध शांफतपूर्ण संफध पर हस्ताक्षर करने के इरादे से बेशकयिम के गेन्ट में फर्मी थे। हस्ताक्षररत संफध के अनुसार, सभी फवफजत राज्यम कम वापस फकया जाना था।

संफध ने उन आयमगम की यमजना बनाने का मागग भी प्रशस्त फकया जम अमेररका और कनाडा के बीच म जूद सीमा मुदम कम हकिरते थे। हस्ताक्षररत संफध के माध्यम से, अमेररकी अपनी युद्ध भूफम और जहाजम कम बहाकिरने में सक्रम थे फजन्हें अंग्रेजम ने कब्जा कर फया था (कु मि, 133)। इसके अगिवा, संफध ने अंग्रेजम कम अपने कब्जे वा दासम कम वापस करने का वादा करने में यमगदान फदया।

1812 की सगिता एंडर यू जैक्सन के प्रयासम पर आधाररत है, 1815 में, एंडर यू जैक्सन ने अपने खराब प्रफशफक्षत सैफनकम के साथ फमकिर न्यू ऑरफयिन्स की डाई जीतने में कामयाबी हाफसकी। अंग्रेजम और अमेररफकयम के बीच युद्ध हुआ था, फजन्हें हस्ताक्षररत संफध की खबर नहीं फमगी थी।

एंडर यू जैक्सन ने अपनी बडी संख्या में अमेररकी सेना के साथ तीन सातिक चो युद्ध में अछी तरह से प्रफशफक्षत और सुसशक्ति फफिटश सैफनकम कम हराने में कामयाबी हाफसकी थी (औफचर्नकि, 89)। न्यू ऑरफयिन्स की डाई ने अमेररकी स्वयंसेवकम के राष्ट्रवाद कम फचफत्रत फकया था, इसफिए एंडर यू जैक्सन के महत्व कम दशागता है।

अंत में, 1812 का युद्ध फफिटश और अमेररफकयम के बीच संघषग के पररणामस्वरूप था, यह फफिटश द्वारा अमेररकी तटथता की अनदेखी के पररणामस्वरूप हुआ था। 1812 का युद्ध तीन सातिक चागि युद्ध के अगिवा अमेररकी व्यापारक गफतफवफध में फगरावट के कारण, इसने कई मगम की जान भी गी। अंग्रेजम ने भारतीयम के साथ फमकिर अमेररफकयम से डाई डी फजससे अमेररकी शशकतयम में कमी आई। हाफिक, एंडर यू जैक्सन के प्रयास के साथ युद्ध के हाँक के प्रयासम ने अंग्रेजम के श्कखी अमेररकी सैफनकम की सगिता में बहुत यमगदान फदया।
