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
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

far and near. As we retrospect on our campus life by flipping through


these pages on some day, your ineffable contribution towards this



DIRECTOR OF EXAMINATIONS

The Centre for Examinations plays an important role in the conduct of the internal examinations as well as the University examinations. There are two internal examinations conducted in a semester. The first one is done after the completion of the first two modules and the second one is the model examination covering the entire syllabus. The Centre for examinations generate the question papers for both the internal examinations from the question bank prepared by the departments for various courses following the Bloom's Taxonomy. Since June 2022, the external examinations have been conducted intact with the academic calendar of the university. All examinations are conducted in the conventional mode except the first year PG 2022 batch which was in barcoded system. This new challenge is also successfully taken up by the Centre for the students of both regular and the school of distance education. A detailed session was organized by the Centre to all the faculty members for familiarizing the new barcoded system. The question papers sent online by the university are printed at the Centre and distributed to the respective venues. Apart from the seating arrangements and invigilation duties, the sorting and the packing of the answer scripts are taken up by the Centre. I sincerely thank and appreciate for the contributions of all the teaching and non-teaching members of the staff for the assistance and support extended to the Centre for Examinations.

Nurturing Excellence and Enriching College Experience



In collaboration with KITTS, Govt. of Kerala, we introduced a three-year diploma course in Hotel Management in 2000, marking a significant milestone. In 2002, Naipunnya Institute of Management and Information Technology (NIMIT) was inaugurated, affiliated with the University of Calicut. The expansion continued in 2012 with the establishment of Naipunnya Business School (NBS), approved by AICTE.

services.


7. Earn and Learn: We implemented the Earn and Learn program, providing opportunities for students to gain practical experience while earning an income.

With a deep sense of contentment and gratitude to God Almighty for showering his abundant blessings upon all the department endeavors, I am happy to present the achievements and the progress the department made during the academic year 2022 - 23 to improve the academic offerings and students' learning experiences.

Department - An overview

The Department of Commerce has been scaling heights ever since its inception. The Department offers both UG and PG programmes. In UG, the department offers B.com with three specialisations, viz, finance, computer application and cooperation and BBA. In P.G., the department offers M.com with finance as specialization. It has 680 students doing various UG programmes and 28 students doing P.G. programme. The department has 28 faculty in which eight have Ph.D and four have M.Phil Degrees.

Capability Enhancement

A Bridge Course on Basics of Accounting was provided for the first year non - commerce students. It was conducted in the beginning of the first semester. 39 students attended the bridge course. Ability test was conducted for the first year students to assess their knowledge and abilities in quantitative aptitude, IT, and GK. The students were categorized based on their performance to provide them an idea regarding the area for improvement. With a view to enhance the employability, the department has provided with three different Add on Courses - Diploma in International Finance and Accounts, M.S. Excel and Tally software,- this academic year for the final year UG students. 109 students have opted for the Diploma in International Finance and Accounts, 91 students selected the MS Excel course and 32 students were opted the Tally Software course. The department has also provided three different Add on Courses - Logistics and supply chain management, Event Management and Digital Marketing- this academic year for second year UG students. 83 students have opted for the Logistics and supply chain management, 73 students selected the Event Management and 79 students opted the Digital Marketing course.

The department is offering CMA which is a professional qualification in cost and management accounts having much demand in the national and international job markets. 43 students in the UG classes

are undergoing CMA course this year. 11 students of 2020 admission have successfully completed their CMA course. Two professional courses in accounting –CPA and ACCA– were also begun this year. All the first year students attended certificate course in language skill development offered by the department of English.

Training Programmes

The whole student community of the department underwent various training programmes initiated by the Training Dept. of NIMIT. Programs offered to all the batches of students including Skill Enrichment Program (SEP), Meraki, Leading Hands Program (LHP), Super sweeps, Be- Hub, and Power Talks. Exclusive Programs were offered for the first year UG students including Induction and Orientation.

Career guidance, internship and placement

The career guidance programmes were carried out for the final year UG and PG students very effectively by the Placement cell of the department. Career orientation on the topic 'Overseas education, universities and foreign languages' was attended by all final year UG and PG students. Webinar on "MBA as a career option" was also conducted. Students got the opportunity to interact with the experts during the session. 30 hours training programme was given to all needy students to help them in writing competitive examination. The department has given opportunity to the students to do internship online and offline mode. 52 students successfully completed the internship during this academic year. With regard to placement, I am happy to mention that the final year UG and PG students were provided an opportunity to participate in the recruitment drive arranged in association with GOAN Institute and Sutherland. 42 students were selected by IIMS for skill development training and thereafter for placement in various companies.

Participative Learning/Interactive Learning

Along with the class room session, the practical exposure of the work life is also provided to the students. The department has conducted 4 sessions of Industry Interactions. The experts from different Industries have taken fruitful Sessions for the students. One-day workshop on share trading was also organized for the students with a view to help them for share trading.

Club Activities

Two important Clubs functioning in the department are Entrepreneurship Development Club and Quiz Club.

The Entrepreneurship Development Club (ED Club) organized various programs under the Earn While Learn initiative in which the students were actively participated. The Onam Chanda, Christmas Fair and Friday market on every Friday are the various main activities organized by the ED Club during the academic year. These activities helped 238 students of the department to make a total earnings of Rs. 158362/-. The 'Flair Com' Quiz Club offers a Unique and exciting way to motivate, inspire, encourage and reward students for their quest for knowledge. In association with "Swaraj" the Independence Day Celebrations, the quiz Club conducted a competition on the topic "Indian Independence Day Related History". Quiz Competition was also conducted in association with 'Avani', the Onam Celebration.

Outreach Programme

Students were able to develop a deeper understanding and concern for the society by engaging in social service activities. Outreach programmes for the department were well planned and executed. The second year students (Batch 2021-24) hosted Snehasagamam - A day for the differently abled members of the society with a true spirit of concern and selflessness. An amount of Rs. 42000/- collected from the students, teachers and well-wishers, is handed over to the principal towards Snehasagamam fund.

Research and publication

The final year UG and PG project work was carried out efficiently. Each student did the project under the guidance of a faculty member. RQAC (Research Quality Assurance Cell) in the department monitored the quality of research. Faculty and students in the department had a publication in various UGC recognized and other journals and periodicals. The faculty members and student community enthusiastically took part in various national and international seminars and workshops and did variety of paper presentations. It was indeed a great year in terms

of paper presentations and Publications. The department has published the proceedings of national conference in 'Dhanpath -23' with ISBN number and 'El-Commercio'in every month. A text book on 'Financial Management' was also published by Dr. Ann Mary jones and Mr. Jefin Antony during this academic year.

International and National Conferences

Department organized 'DHANPATH 2K23' an International Conference on 'Innovative Trends in Business Commerce and Management' in Hybrid Mode on March 24, 2023. The Conference intended to provide a forum that brought together researchers from academia and industry to convene and swap over the ideas and recent research work that endow innovation. Dr Mariam Ciby Anil, Assistant Professor, Dhofar University, Salalah Oman, Mr. Antony Ronald Simon, Assistant Director, Strategic Management, Indian Ports Association, Ministry of Ports-Shipping and waterways and Mr. P S Menon, FCA, Former Chairman, Cochin Stock Brokers Ltd handled various technical sessions. All the sessions were very informative and relevant to the topic. Thirty-seven papers were presented in the conference and ninety-eight delegates participated in the conference.

Resonance 2K23

'Resonance 2K23', a National level cultural and management fest, was organized by Commerce Association on 11th and 12th January 2023. It is a platform for students from various schools and colleges to exhibit their various talents. 327 students from various schools and colleges participated 14 events. A total of Rs.120000/- cash prize was given to the winners of various competitions.

Industrial Visit

The Department organized an Industrial visit for the final year B.com and BBA students during the month of August, 2022. B.Com. Finance and B.Com. Co-operation students visited Tollins Tyres and PDDP and B.Com CA and BBA students visited KSE Ltd. In total around 225 students participated for IV. Students got an industrial exposure and experience through this IV. Mr. Jefin Antony co-ordinated the IV.

Book distribution

Text books were distributed to the odd and even semester UG and PG students of the Department of Commerce at a concessional rate. In total students were given around 45,000 rupees as discount during the academic year 2022-2023. The department also provided books at free of cost to some of the students who are financially very much backward. Mr. Jefin Antony coordinated the book distribution.

PG Outbound Programme

Second year M. Com students visited Christ University, Pune Lavasa campus as a part of their P.G. Outbound program which lasted for 1 week that was from 13th November to 20th November 2022. They engaged in various kind of activities such as team-building exercises, outdoor activities, and other experiential learning activities. They also got an opportunity to interact with the faculty and students at the campus which in turn, helped for cultural exchange. It also helped in the development of specific skills and competencies of the students. Ms. Anitha Mary and Mr. Jefin Antony were the teacher co-ordinators for the PG Outbound programme.

Financial Help

An amount of Rs. 5000/- was given to two students under 'Scholarship through Sponsorship'. Rs. 10000/- was given to two students to help them to participate in national volley ball coaching camp. Rs. 100000 plus amount was collected from the students and teachers of the department had contributed to the Rebuild mission of the college to help a homeless student of the Naipunnnya college.

Other Important matters.

- Produced 3 Ph.Ds. in commerce during the academic year under the guidance of Dr. Mathew Jose k.
- Three Faculty Exchange Programmes (FEP) were conducted with the MoU with other colleges.
- More than eighty students of the department had participated in various inter-collegiate fest in Kerala this year and many of them came up gaining good experience and with some winning stories to script.
- Alumni meet was conducted.
- Mentoring by teachers to all students in the department was given on a regular basis. The students who had problems and wanted serious counselling were sent to 'Prthidhi (college counselling center) from where the students were able to get the service of expert counselors free of cost.
- Three Faculty Development Programme (FDP) was organized by the department for the members of the faculty on 'Research Article Writing', 'Virtual mode technique for effective teaching' and 'Introduction to the world of SAP'
- National statistics day and world Consumer Rights day were observed with seminar and Quiz competition.
- Union budget 2023 Analysis competition was organized.
- PTWA meetings were arranged for all batches.

Department of Computer Science is able to achieve its objectives set at the beginning of the academic year 2022-23.

Oneday Hardware and Network Troubleshooting workshop were arranged for the final year BSc CS and BCA students. The objective of this workshop is to provide hands-on training to the students on hardware and network-related concepts and troubleshooting.

The department organized conference for the ninth consecutive year and this year being its first International Conference, it conducted in hybrid mode, with the theme "Advanced and Emerging Trends in Computer Science". The keynote address was given by Prof. Dr. M Sudheep Elayidom, HOD, Department of Computer Science, School of Engineering, CUSAT. Dr. Smitha Harikumar, Principal, Chinmaya College of Arts, Commerce & Science, Tripunithura, Dr. Sarika S, Associate Professor, Department of Computer Science, NIMIT and Dr. Soni P M, Assistant Professor, Department of Computer Science, NIMIT, chaired the sessions. There were 33, papers presented at the conference, which were published in the conference proceedings.

Three add-on courses were provided to all students of BSc CS and BCA. Final year students attended 35 hours course on "Image Processing and Introduction to Machine Learning.", second-year students attended 30 hours course on "Python Programming" and first-year students attended 30 hours course on "Basic Communication Skills". All the three courses were certified by STED Council. A workshop on "Introduction to Electronic Devices" was given to the second-year BCA students. The objective of this workshop is to give a brief idea about the electronic devices, circuits, and a few lab experiments, which were intended to provide a hands-on session for BCA students.

Department undertook initiatives like internships and earn while learn programmes for the students. The internship is offered to final students in the form of 25 hours of training in collaboration with a reputed IT organization at Angamaly. Earn while learn a programme is intended to provide an opportunity for students to earn an income while they pursue their undergraduate degree.

IT Club, the flagship club of the Department of Computer Science, was inaugurated in a modest function within the college. IT club took the initiative to organize interdepartmental quiz and actively supported the conduct of intercollegiate IT fest, 'Zenorix 4.0', that received an overwhelming response from the student community from near and far by colleges. It was a one-day fest with 8 events planned and conducted by the students, backed by the faculty coordinators.

Industrial visits and industry interactions were organized to bridge the gap between the industry and academia. As industry visit, final year BCA and BSC CS students visited NeST Technologies, Kalamassery and Webandcrafts, Infopark Koratty, respectively. Industry interaction on “Digitalization in Healthcare Delivery and Marketing” was done by Mr. Sreeraj B, Assistant General Manager, Mar Sleeva Medicity, Pala.

As a technology tribute to commemorate the silver jubilee year of Naipunnnya, students from the Department of Computer Science developed a robot nick named ‘Eva’, that can interact with human beings. It was demonstrated during the formal function of the college day.

To strengthen the concepts learned in the course ‘Computer graphics’, a mini-project was given to second-year BCA students. They were able to explore and experiment with graphic library functions while writing programs.

The Student Support Programme (SSP) received warm support from the students. Under this programme, academically weak students were given additional support in the form of extra classes and peer teaching. Students who performed well in academic activities were given sessions to encourage them to explore the higher realms of their respective subjects. Two such initiatives by the department are sessions on “Java Script” and “Writing Research article”, given to first and second-year students respectively.

Members of the Faculty attended two weeks online Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on computer science areas like machine learning and data science. Dr. Sarika S, Associate Professor, Department of Computer Science, NIMIT conducted 2 international workshops, 1 national workshop and 3 college level workshops on ‘LaTex’, - a document preparation system used for the communication and publication of scientific documents. Ms. Laiby Thomas, Assistant Professor, Department of Computer Science, NIMIT, was invited as the chief guest for the association inauguration and as the keynote speaker on the topic “Future of Artificial Intelligence in Education” at Carmel College, Mala. Mr. Livin P Wilson, Assistant Professor, Department of Computer Science, NIMIT, authored and published a book titled “Sensors and Transducers”, that can serve as a reference book for the common course with the same title, for the third semester BSc CS and BCA.

Six members of the faculty in the department are pursuing their doctoral studies. There were 3 Web Science publications, 16 UGC publications and 5 ISSN publications by the faculty. Dr. Sarika S, Associate Professor, Department of Computer Science, NIMIT, has qualified National Eligibility Test in Computer Science stream.

Final year BSc CS and BCA students went to Coorg, Chikmagalur and Belur respectively as a part of their study tour. Students took part in various management and IT fests conducted by other institutions.

Mentoring programme is well received by the student community and has helped the faculty to foster a better relationship with the students.

On behalf of the Department of Computer Science, I express my sincere gratitude to the management, colleagues and students for their whole hearted support for the smooth functioning of the department.

Since its inception in the year 2010, the Department of Training and Development at NIMIT continues to fulfill its mission of supporting and moulding the young aspirants to reach the unreachable. The Department oversees and runs a variety of student development activities to provide them the right knowledge, skills and aptitude required to improve employability and to live harmoniously in the dynamic environments.

The vibrant training team includes professional trainers and a few members of the faculty, who are experienced trainers along with their specialization in various domains. They determine the areas where training is most required, deliver the training and analyze its success.

The objective of our team is to improve organizational effectiveness and promote faculty-student growth by offering leading educational training programs. Training is meant to fulfill the needs and goals of the individual, the group, the department, and the organization. We work to ameliorate each person's learning and development as a means of creating outstanding people who possess the qualities necessary to have an influence that endures beyond a lifetime.

The department flagged off the academic year 2022-2023 with Aarambh, the official Inauguration and orientation of Leading Hands Program (LHP). To lead others effectively, people need to lead themselves first. Leaders thrive is a training program hosted exclusively for the Leading hands to get an insight into how to unlock leadership potential. We had 5 Power talks this year, a short inspiring talk by the students which helped the participants to hone personality and boost confidence. Nexus, the first year's orientation program was organized by the department to familiarize students to an unknown campus environment, its faculties and infrastructure which sets a lasting impression for the new students. It is not easy to be pre-eminent in this competitive world. Considering the intense battle for available jobs in today's employment market, interview skills are of high importance for all students. Hence the department offers 'Finishing Touch' a 30 hour of interview skill training program certified by Rubicon Pvt.Ltd. for the final years and this year more than 400 students received the certificates.

The department provides 'Skill Enrichment Program (SEP)', a certificate program in soft skills with a course duration of 75 hours based on an excellent syllabus, spread out in 3 years and certified by STED Council of India. This academic year 300 students were eligible and were awarded the certificates. This Enrichment program offers students a variety of educational resources and learning opportunities, all aimed to prepare them for success in college and in the workplace. It aids students in developing their skills in their specialized arena and they get a chance to innovate fresh activities and learn new genre .

Walk with Scholar seeks to develop the abilities of deserving students with effective mentoring, direction, and inspiration. The WWS programme was added as a training department effort in the most recent academic year. The institution conducts the training at the departmental and college levels. Youth Empowerment Series is the new endeavor of the department commenced in September 2022 and we could conduct 4 series. It is an inter university student exchange training program to mould young talents and create an opportunity for students to learn, to prosper and to work with others in a different cultural milieu. The scholars get an opportunity to impart knowledge to their juniors through an exclusive program 'Student Guru'. In this year we were able to conduct two series effectively, in which Scholars take up the role of teachers and share their knowledge and skills. Recognizing the fact that simple but healthy actions of a student, repeated on a daily basis, becomes a habit within a month and will gradually become part of their character. Behavioral Enhancement Hub introduces a healthy habit along with a positive vibe challenge every month in the campus to practise. We practised five habits this year from October to February and the winners of the challenge were acknowledged.

Meraki and Synergia is the seated forum for UG and PG students, a platform for students to perform in corporate style and inculcate a holistic development among the students. 23 Meraki and 2 Synergia were conducted this year. Expert Nxt is an initiative, which allows students to interact with eminent personalities and real life heroes. We were able to organize 3 in this year. Giftz Spot is another initiative by the department where students get an opportunity to earn while learning. This year we had Onam and Christmas sales. Face2Face was yet another remarkable event conducted by the department. We were able provide the entire student community an opportunity to meet the candidates for the College Union Election.

Naipunnya Digital is a fun and infotainment-packed YouTube channel for students to excel and explore their talents. This is a platform that gives students an opportunity to showcase their potential and spread positive vibes. A glimpse of every celebration and happenings in the campus was updated in the channel and more than 100 students got the opportunity to showcase their talents and improve their skills, Tasty Treats (a cookery show presenting student chefs), Alumni Speaks, Soul cafe, Fitness studio and so on.

Placement Cell of NIMIT is an interface between our job seeking students and job providers from various professions. The placement team is responsible for operationalizing the placement process in every academic year. IT Department, as a team, in NIMIT monitors the maintenance of all computer systems, network services and devices, software and IT related functions. The main duties and responsibilities entrusted on us are the maintenance services including hardware, networking, software and Internet of Things.

Hardware maintenance includes assembling and installations of the new computers systems, printers and other electronic devices in the computer labs, class rooms and staff rooms of each block. We have also taken steps to improve the network facilities in the campus, checking network connections and internet facilities. We have played a major role in servicing hardware products.

Technology will not be able to avoid the onset of a pandemic; nevertheless, it can assist in managing a crisis more effectively. The department has provided full support to conduct online meetings, classes, competitions, video recording, YouTube live streaming and created so many brochures and e-certificates not only for our college but also for other reputed organizations. IT department is creating promotional videos and highlights videos for the events happening in Naipunnya.

This department has started NITCS (Naipunnya IT Consultancy Services) which offers consultancy services to other organizations. Our services include: Software & website development, KOHA & Moodle implementation and training, Google applications training etc... We have also developed websites for Bharatmatha School of Legal Studies, Choondi and for Naipunnya Business School, Koratty. The department also developed a feedback software for Naipunnya Public School, Edakkunnu.

Our department has started IT Apprenticeship Programme last year with the aim of earn while learn for Naipunnya students. This year we have conducted the second phase of the same and five of our Computer Science students were selected as apprentice and they worked with IT team after their regular class hours and they were also given stipend in each month.

The department has proved its excellence in maintaining the E-College software "Linways", where we manage personal information of the students, attendance entry, marks tabulation etc. We have developed two new softwares named SmartSupport and MentorMate. SmartSupport software is used to register IT, Electrical and Plumbing related complaints/requests which can be monitored and solved more effectively. MentorMate is used to process all the mentoring details of the students. We also developed an admission software for collecting and processing the details of new admissions and thus generating the ID cards and bus concession cards automatically using the software.

Development of Students Feedback software is another success of the IT team.

We are also providing continuous support to the IQAC cell of Naipunnya by uploading and maintaining NAAC related document and files.

NOTE (Naipunnya Online Training and Examination) is a centre under IT department. NSEIT, the IT division of National Stock Exchange is conducting online examinations in our computer lab for Indian Institute of Banking and Finance (IIBF), FACT, CUSAT etc. The other organizations we collaborate are:: TCS, Avneer Business Chamber, Sify, Sai Educare and Satvat.

As the world is moving at a faster pace in the field of Information Technology, we are updating our knowledge and skills on the latest software, implementing it in Naipunnya, making it easier and friendlier to the users.

QATAR'S MARKETING PROPAGANDA

UNVEILING THE TACTICS BEHIND
HOSTING THE FIFA WORLD CUP

Why Qatar is in danger because of its neighbourhood rivals?

Middle eastern country's technique to diversify the income

How the middle eastern country is trying to
remove the over-dependence on oil
and gas

There were five bids remaining for the 2022 FIFA World Cup: Australia, Japan, Qatar, South Korea and the United States. The 22-member FIFA Executive Committee convened in Zürich on 2 December 2010, to vote and select the hosts of both tournaments. Two FIFA executive committee members were suspended before the vote due to allegations of corruption regarding their votes. The decision to host the 2022 World Cup in Qatar was made in 2010, since then a massive amount of money has been invested in Qatar, a country situated in the middle east.

The tiny gulf nation has embarked a stadium-building spree to host the cup, bringing in thousands upon thousands of migrant labourers. The tournament was highly controversial and expensive, Saudi Arabia, the United Arab Emirates, Egypt, Bahrain and others to cut diplomatic ties due to Qatar's alleged support for terrorist groups. The FIFA allows oppressive regime to host major events like the Olympics, which is known as sports washing. This practice often diverts attention from the crimes committed by the hosting country, presenting a glamorous spectacle instead. The FIFA World Cup in Qatar 2022 has been one of the most sensational events of the year, following the Russian invasion of Ukraine.



By now, people around the world must be aware of the bizarre economics surrounding organization of FIFA. For those who are not aware, let me explain. Africa spent 3.6 billion, Brazil spent \$15 billion, and Russia spent \$11.6 billion to host previous World Cups. However, Qatar alone has spent approximately \$220 billion on hosting the World Cup. It is important to note that we are talking about a country that is practically a desert. Nevertheless, the Qatari government has managed to build new stadiums, brand new roads, countless hotels, a new metro system and even have the air conditioning. While many people may think that the money spent is worth it and that the World Cup is an extremely profitable event, the reality is that hosting the World Cup and the Olympics is a complete waste of money. The host country bears the complete expenses of super-expensive infrastructure projects, while significant revenue from ticketing, merchandise, and sponsorship

goes directly to FIFA. After the World Cup, this infrastructure often becomes a wasteful expenditure.

For example, the Brazilian stadium used for hosting the World Cup is now used as a bus depot. In Qatar's case, despite spending over \$200 billion, the country is only expected to make \$15-20 billion in return. This raises the question of why Qatar is hosting the FIFA World Cup, which is a ridiculous waste of money. What are the hidden geopolitical motives behind Qatar's decision? This is a question raised by many commerce students who want to understand the marketing propaganda of hosting the World Cup.

To understand this deep story, we have to understand the vulnerabilities of Qatar and how much is Qatar in danger. The first one that Qatar has is about the overdependence on oil and gas. And if you look at the GDP almost 60 % of their GDP only comes from oil and gas and considering the speedy action of the world against climate change, if you look at this graph by British petroleum Graph Because 4 out of 6 oil buyers intend to achieve net zero emissions by 2050, the demand for oil will decrease or slow down by 71 %, meanwhile as you can see from this graph Graph The cost of renewable energy has started dropping below the fossil fuel cost So Qatar can no longer depend upon oil beyond 2050. The second problem that Qatar faces is location, now if you look at the map it is surrounded by rivals from all directions and these countries are Saudi Arabia, Egypt, UAE and Bahrain. As you could imagine these are not ordinary rivals, but these rivals include two of the most powerful oil countries in the world Saudi and UAE. The only reason why Qatar is surviving is because of a security guarantee from the US. So in the next 30 years, when oil And gas will be no longer valuable and if we withdraw its guarantee. it won't take a lot of time for the rivals around the country to conquer Qatar. And Qatar's army is too small that it only has 22,000 men Even for the world cup, they had to import the Pakistani army for help. This is the reason why not just Qatar but every other middle eastern country is trying to diversify their income so that they can have a source of

revenue and an alternate instrument of leverage in geopolitics Now if you look at other countries, they all have very significant diversification instruments, for example, UAE is a financial and transshipment hub in the form of Dubai, and for Saudi, it is critical access to the red sea and the swiss canal and this is critically important because 30% of the entire world's container traffic flows through the swiss canal so if Saudi wants a source of income, they can charge all the ships and make money out of sea toll. But if you look at Qatar it's on the other side of the land and it is nowhere near close to uae in terms of diversification, this is the second problem that Qatar has and this brings us to the last problem of Qatar and that is its global image Now people when I say Dubai, you can see the magnificent infrastructure there right, when I say new York you can see images of the times square garden, but when I say Qatar what comes into your mind well nothing but the desert, this is again the biggest problems of Qatar which is global perception, so put it on a scale Qatar is on for solving three major challenges by 2015 Number 1 is economic diversification from oil Number 2 is a long-standing security guarantee even after the oil gets over And the last challenge is to improve its image in front of foreign investors So the question is how is Qatar going to solve these problems and the question is what is the connection of these problems with the world cup Well the first part of the answer lies in the term which is known by the term sports washing To explain you about it sports washing is a public relation strategy that is deployed to clean the image of the company in the eyes of the international audience, in simple

words, this is a tool of propaganda as well and it is to be remembered that the tool of sports washing has been used since the times of Hitler. (the city of berlin was awarded the auspicious task of hosting the 1936 summer Olympic games, it would have been the first time a host nation would project political ideology and power onto the world, german athletes were soldiers in the propaganda battle)(berlin was completely cleaned up then, anti-Jewish signs were removed and will remove everything which would create a bad impression and which would prove the hospital climate around the country was true. And no one then would have predicted that these games would be used as a tool for the slickest propaganda by one of the most tyrannical regimes the world has ever seen)

In the early 1920s, Germany experienced severe hyperinflation, leading to widespread unemployment, starvation, and poverty. However, over the next decade, Germany made significant progress and sought to showcase its development to the world. This was one reason why Germany won the bid to host the 1936 Olympics. During this time, Adolf Hitler became the dictator of Germany, and the propaganda minister saw an opportunity to promote three ideas: the new Germany under Hitler, the superiority of Germany's dictatorship over European democracies, and the concept of the Aryan race. The 1936 Olympics became a powerful tool of propaganda, with Hitler releasing messages of peace and Germans showing respect to athletes, especially African Americans, which changed perceptions. This change in perception gave Hitler immense power both within and outside Germany. This

strategy, known as sports washing, has been employed by other leaders as well. Similarly, Qatar is hosting the World Cup to demonstrate its development and divert attention from its human rights violations and other issues. Hosting major sporting events like the World Cup also helps attract foreign investments, with Qatar offering incentives such as tax exemptions and land allocation projects. Qatar's Qatar Investment Authority, a wealth fund, plays a significant role in deciding where to invest its unlimited cash. Qatar has acquired extensive property holdings worldwide, giving it access to influential individuals and allowing it to influence politics and policies. This strategy mirrors what Russia

did with Gazprom, a state energy company, and its investments in European football. By using sports investment, enticing foreign investments, and gaining access to powerful circles, Qatar aims to make a name for itself in the global economy while trying to prevent its blessings from turning into a curse.

Born and brought up in the poorer section of the society, I've been through a lot of sufferings in my life.




Though I must leave this place, I wait eagerly for my wings to grow back, to once again take flight into the world of dreams.



माता-पिता को खोना मानवीय अनुभवों में सबसे भावनात्मक रूप से कठिन और सार्वभौमिक है। और यद्यपि हम यह समझ सकते हैं कि अमूर्त अर्थों में माता-पिता का नुकसान अनिवार्य है, यह ज्ञान माता या पिता की मृत्यु पर दुख को कम नहीं करता है। माता-पिता को खोना दुःख से भरा और दर्दनाक होता है, और यह किसी भी उम्र के बच्चों को जैविक और मनोवैज्ञानिक रूप से स्थायी रूप से बदल देता है। कुछ भी फिर कभी पहले जैसा नहीं रहता; पिता या माता को खोना पूरी तरह से परिवर्तनकारी घटना है।

मनोचिकित्सक निकोल बेंडर्स-हादी, एमडी, डॉक्टर ऑफ बिहेवियरल हेल्थ के मेडिकल डायरेक्टर कहते हैं, "सबसे अच्छी स्थिति में, माता-पिता को खोने का अनुमान लगाया जाता है, और परिवारों को तैयार होने, अलविदा कहने और समर्थन के साथ खुद को घेरने का समय है।" माँग। "ऐसे मामलों में जहां मौत अप्रत्याशित होती है, जैसे गंभीर बीमारी या दर्दनाक दुर्घटना के साथ, वयस्क बच्चे समय की विस्तारित अवधि के लिए इनकार और क्रोध के चरणों में रह सकते हैं ... [अग्रणी] प्रमुख अवसादग्रस्तता विकार या यहां तक कि PTSD का निदान, अगर आघात शामिल है। "मुकाबला करना कम तनावपूर्ण होता है जब वयस्क बच्चों के पास माता-पिता की मृत्यु का अनुमान लगाने का समय होता है।"

जब माता-पिता को खोना बहुत अधिक हो

दुख विकट हो जाता है जब शोक संतप्त इतने दूर हो जाते हैं कि वे हानि के बाद अपने जीवन को जारी रखने में असमर्थ होते हैं। प्रारंभिक अध्ययनों में यह लगभग 1% स्वस्थ आबादी में होता है, और लगभग 10% आबादी में जिन्हें पहले तनाव विकार का निदान किया गया था। ओमोजोला कहते हैं, "मृत्यु के तीन महीने के भीतर समायोजन विकार का निदान किया जाता है, अगर संस्कृति और धर्म के लिए सामान्य से अधिक 'दुःख की प्रतिक्रिया' होती है।" "इस स्थिति में, दुःखी वयस्क को सामाजिक, व्यावसायिक और अन्य अपेक्षित, महत्वपूर्ण जीवन कार्यों को पूरा करने में गंभीर चुनौतियाँ होती हैं।"

माता-पिता की मृत्यु पर दुख

“माता-पिता की मृत्यु के मद्देनजर अनसुलझा दुःख चिंता और अवसाद में बढ़ सकता है।”

अधिक ठोस शब्दों में, माता-पिता की मृत्यु के मद्देनजर अनसुलझा दुःख चिंता और अवसाद में बढ़ सकता है। यह विशेष रूप से सच है जब दीदी हिर्श मेंटल हेल्थ सर्विसेज के मुख्य परिचालन अधिकारी और लाइसेंस प्राप्त चिकित्सक लिन मॉरिस के अनुसार माता-पिता की आत्महत्या से मृत्यु हो जाती है। “वयस्क जो माता-पिता को आत्महत्या के लिए खो देते हैं, वे अक्सर जटिल भावनाओं जैसे कि अपराध, क्रोध और परित्याग और भेद्यता की भावनाओं से संघर्ष करते हैं,” मॉरिस कहते हैं। जॉन्स हॉपकिन्स यूनिवर्सिटी के 2010 के एक अध्ययन में पाया गया कि आत्महत्या के लिए माता-पिता को खोने से बच्चों को आत्महत्या से मरने का अधिक खतरा होता है।

एलिज़ाबेथ

गोल्डबर्ग, न्यूयॉर्क शहर में एक रिश्ते चिकित्सक जो दुःखी वयस्कों के साथ काम करता है, ने टोल देखा है कि लंबे समय तक दुःख शादी पर ले सकता है। विशेष रूप से, गोल्डबर्ग माता-पिता को खोने और जीवनसाथी को धोखा देने के बीच एक (कुछ हद तक प्रायडियन) लिंक का सुझाव देते हैं। “मैं कई मामलों को माता-पिता को खोने के अनसुलझे दुःख की अभिव्यक्ति के रूप में देखती हूं,” वह कहती हैं। “वयस्क बच्चा अविश्वास की स्थिति में रहता है और इस भ्रम को दूर करने के लिए कई तरह से वास्तविकता को खारिज करता है कि माता-पिता अभी भी जीवित हैं। दुःखी बच्चे को एक नया लगाव आंकड़ा चाहिए; यह मानस है जो इनकार और दुःख को समेटने की कोशिश कर रहा है। इसलिए यह कहने के बजाय, ‘मेरी माँ मर गई,’ दुःखी बच्चा कह सकता है, ‘जब तक माँ दूर है, मैं अपने जीवनसाथी के अलावा किसी और के साथ खेलूँगा।’”
