

WASTE MANAGEMENT POLICY

1.0 Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to offer guidance to staff and students and define responsibilities in all aspects of Waste Management with standards for appropriate waste segregation, storage, handling, transport, and disposal. The policy aims for a healthy, prospering and resource-efficient campus in which waste is reduced, reused, recycled, and prevented wherever practicable and disposed of in an environmentally safe method.

2.0 Scope

This policy applies to all activities on campus, and it applies to all staff, students, and guests.

3.0 Responsibility

The institution requires that everyone using the facilities, including students, all teaching and non-teaching staff and visitors shall abide by this Policy.

4.0 Objectives

- To ensure that waste management is carried out in line with all waste legislation requirements, including the duty of care, and to plan for and minimize the effects of future legislative changes.
- To encourage repair, reuse, and recycling as opposed to waste disposal in a cost-effective way, and to limit waste generation at the source.
- To clearly define roles and duties in order to identify and coordinate each waste management action.
- To promote environmental consciousness in order to enhance and inspire waste reduction, reuse, and recycling.
- To invest in increasing recycling options on the college campus and turning trash into goods with value added.
- To ensure that waste is handled and stored safely on the college campus.
- To provide adequate waste management training to teachers, residents, staff, students, and other stakeholders.
- To promote a campus-wide, integrated approach to waste management.

5.0 Waste Management in the Campus

5.1 Solid Waste Management

- Colour coded dustbins are used for different types of wastes in and around the campus.
- Waste bins are located across campus in locations such as classrooms, faculty rooms, administration offices, computer labs, libraries, corridors, washrooms, and common rooms.

- Old newspapers, files, home assignments, and so on are transferred to other agencies for recycling.
- The college's NSS unit is always striving towards cleanliness.
- Every week, it runs a campus cleanliness initiative to collect garbage and solid waste.
- Compost Pits are also provided in the college campus.


5.2 Liquid Waste Management

- Toilets and restrooms generate liquid waste, which is stored in separate chambers and collected through pipelines.
- For watering the vegetable garden, raw water from the canteen is obtained from a separate pipe line.

5.3 E-waste Management
